

The City of Beaver Dam has been in contact with the FBI in preparation for the Intentional Burn of 109 Knaup Drive following the Explosion that took place on Monday, March 5, 2019. As part of the preparation, it was determined that Bomb Techs from the FBI needed to conduct a preparatory sweep of the building prior to the burn for the removal of ammunitions and hazardous materials.

Due to the need for Bomb Techs to make entry for this purpose, it has been determined that during that sweep, those bomb techs could also grab some important property while they are in the various apartments. This included items such as important papers, jewelry, money, and other family heirlooms.

While we realize that this is a change in the previous position taken by the city, further analysis led us to believe that this is something that can be accomplished safely utilizing the experts from the FBI Bomb Squad.

This has been a horrific event for all involved and we would like to share that the residents at the 109 Knaup Drive building have handled this life altering incident with grace and impressive understanding of the situation. City of Beaver Dam Officials, Dodge County Officials, and Officials of all assisting agencies are thankful that we were able to make this happen to help ease their loss.

As a reminder, material donations may be made on behalf of the displaced families to St Vincent DePaul's and monetary donations to Horicon Bank.

### Village Glen Apartments Render Safe Operation Burn Plan 109 Knaup Drive, Beaver Dam Wisconsin


This burn plan is to outline the fire protection of the Village Glen Apartments Render Safe Operation thermal destruction of 109 Knaup Drive. This operation will be defensive only – there will be no interior operations conducted in 109 Knaup Drive.

There will be 12 strategically located unmanned ground monitors protecting the obvious exposure structures in the area. These will be supplied either by engines or the Beaver Dam trucks. 4 Engines will be placed near the 105 building, 212 Industrial (Prairie Ridge) and Beaver Dam and Juneau Trucks will be placed near the 113 building. The Juneau truck is to protect the 113 building should the need arise. See attached map. When possible, apparatus shall be placed facing out for egress, with the panel side away from the 109 building. The only personnel allowed inside the 500" mark is command staff and pump operators.

There will be a taskforce staged at 121 Kauap Drive to attack the 113 building. Staging for the 113 task force If there is an exposure fire to the 113 building this fire will be attacked with interior operations. There will be preplaced uncharged attack hose lines on the east and west side of the 113 building.

There will be a tender strike team staged on industrial Drive near 212 Industrial. Engine 1263 at 212 Industrial will be set up for both city and rural operations as a redundant water source. The Tender Strike team will supply E1263. Fill sight for tenders will be at the Hydrant in front of Reed Chrysler 1724 N Spring.

We are also having large shipping containers delivered and placed as a thermal barrier between the 109 building and the 113 building and the garage between the two. We expect these shipping containers to be delivered and in place on Tuesday March 14, 2018.



Post 3) Prohibit vehicles from traveling east on Industrial Dr. and prevent civilians from entering the outter perimeter (Shelter In Place zone). Cones will be utilized to merge traffic to right turn lane to southbound on N. Spring St.

Post 2) Prohibit civilians from crossing Industrial Dr. into the outter perimeter (Shelter In Place zone).

Post 1) Prohibit vehicles from traveling west on Industrial Dr., after exiting US 151 (exit #34). Barricade will be on location in case squad must leave due to smoke.

### 8. Special Instructions

Residents that do not evacuate from the Shelter In Place zone prior to the start of operations may leave their residences, but will not be able to return until roads are reopened.

Wear retro-reflective traffic safety vests at all times when involved with traffic direction duties. Be mindful of approaching traffic from all directions. Maintain 360-degree situational awareness. Watch for falling debris from the fire scene. Advise the command post if smoke from the fire envelops your location.

### GENERAL SAFETY MESSAGE

This incident involved the potential production of TATP and or chemical precursors associated with its manufacture.

- 1. TATP (Triacetone Triperoxide) is a homemade, high explosive material made from three common chemicals that include Acetone and Hydrogen Peroxide. Its strength is approximately 80% of TNT with a RE Factor 0.80.
- 2. TATP looks like a drug powder. It is a white-yellow-brown crystalline powder that looks like meth or cocaine.
- 3. Warning: Officers using a field drug test kit can cause TATP to detonate due to the sulfuric acid in the test kit. Do not use a field drug test on powder that could be TATP.

The destruction of the residual explosives inside the structure will be completed using Thermal decomposition of remaining chemical residues and or finished explosives remaining in the structure. To accomplish this, the structure must reach a sustained temperature exceeding 600 degrees F for at least four hours. Typical Class A material such as a stoked wood fire will usually exceed 1400 degrees F. Since this building has not been prepared for a burn such as having other hazardous materials and furniture removed, we can expect the fire to be much hotter. Likewise, we can anticipate the building contents to include normal household hazardous materials such as cleaning supplies, paints, aerosol cans and cosmetics. Pressurized containers such as the boiler, water heaters and CFC devices such as refrigerators can explode (BLEVE). Because of these hazards, we want the fire to burn uninterrupted for as long as possible with no water application interacting with the fire. Further we will need to maintain adequate standoff distances from the fire to avoid any energetic materials as well as those normal household materials left inside the building.

We can anticipate localized toxic smoke conditions inside the evacuation zone area until the fire reaches adequate temperature to accomplish thermal uplift. As an example, any item containing chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) such as refrigerators, freezers, window mount A/C units, HVAC system (roof or ground mounted) may form phosgene or carbonyl fluorides when burned.

The smoke released by any type of fire (forest, brush, crop, structure, tires, waste or wood burning) is a mixture of particles and chemicals produced by incomplete burning of carbon-containing materials. All smoke contains carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide and particulate matter (PM or soot). Smoke can contain many different chemicals, including aldehydes, acid gases, sulfur dioxide, nitrogen oxides, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), benzene, toluene, styrene, metals and dioxins. The type and amount of particles and chemicals in smoke varies depending on what is burning, how much oxygen is available, and the burn temperature.

The plan for this fire is to maintain as hot a temperature with corresponding thermal updraft as possible. This should consume a large quantity of contaminants in this smoke. If you are operating in your area of assigned responsibility (AOR) and are being exposed to smoke, you must immediately vacate the area or implement the use of an SCBA. Engine Operators should be prepared to operate in SCBA.

### **GENERAL SAFETY MESSAGE**

Only Engine Operators Division Commanders and Safety Officers have authorization to work inside the evacuation zone (see map). If it is authorized for others to work within the zone you will receive word through command regarding who is authorized. In short if you are not authorized to be there do not enter.

Law Enforcement staff will be responsible for perimeter security, pre burn building clearance, and contingency plans associated with US 151 closure in the event smoke causes traffic safety concerns.

Although Safety is the responsibility of all involved in this incident, we will have two dedicated incident safety officers assigned to the event. The safety officers responsibility is to serve as a primary clearinghouse for safety related questions and issues. They are part of the command staff and report directly to the Unified Commanders. As such the Safety Officers will be given the same regard as a direct order from the Unified Commanders.

A Quick Reaction Force (QRF Task Force) made up of two LE Officers and two Firefighters will be staged with full PPE and a gator to respond to emergencies inside the exclusion zone. They will be monitoring all radio frequencies and be staged at the Incident Command Post. The QRF will be deployed at the discretion of the Safety Officers and or Command staff to respond to any life safety or security perimeter breach inside the exclusion zone during thermal destruction.






In coordination with, and with the concurrence of the Beaver Dam Police Department, Beaver Dam Fire & Rescue Departments, and the Dodge County Sheriff's Office, FBI Milwaukee is prepared to conduct a final sweep of the building at 109 Knaup Drive, Beaver Dam, WI, in an attempt to identify any remaining explosive or hazardous materials (such as ammunition) which could pose a safety risk and potentially aggravate the City of Beaver Dam's planned burn operation for the building. In the interests of protecting public safety, FBI Milwaukee, the City of Beaver Dam, and Dodge County agree a final sweep of the building would be prudent. 



### Step One:

Initiate Sampling of Ash and debris as soon as safe and practical after burn pile cools to determine if ash is energetic following the disposition classification system of treated materials.

- · Philosophy of 0, X 3X, 5X classification system
  - Army Industrial Operations Command IOC 385-1
  - P&W Work Instruction 231.07.67, Classification and Decontamination of Explosive Facilities and Equipment
  - Tagging certification and documentation

### X, 3X, 5X, and 0 Definitions

- · X or 1X Routine cleaning
  - Such as end of work day
  - Contamination may be visually detectable
  - Transported only in live area by qualified personnel
  - Further cleaning needed for major maintenance or repair
  - Cannot be sent outside the live area without further decontamination and reclassification
- XXX or 3X Surface contamination removed
  - Visual surface contamination removed
  - Some contamination may be detectable with indicator solutions
  - Significant reactive material may remain in less obvious places
  - Safe for routine maintenance, and careful disassembly (following written procedures accounting for specific hazards)
  - Don't subject to welding, drilling, sawing, etc that may ignite residual contamination

- Not safe for sale to general public
- Only qualified buyers and approved, qualified landfills can receive
- XXXXX or 5X No significant amount of contaminants remain
  - Undergone a verifiable and repeatable decontamination process certified to remove the reactive materials

### Step Two:

If Ash is still energetic 1x- to 3x = Chemical Treatment using contractor. Maintain security watch and fence until plan can be developed.

If Ash is determined energetically safe = 5x or zero, a determination is then needed as to disposal suitability. Maintain security until Law Enforcement is done collecting evidence. Complete search of surrounding areas to ensure no post blast debris is evident. Once completed have City Attorney draft a property release to owner. WDNR Solid Waste should be notified to work with property owner on waste disposition. We recommend the city not be party to any waste disposal.

Step Three: After Ash removal remove fence.
